



Provincial Government


- *PDP proposes, inter alia “a more serious drive to transform and develop rural areas...”*






Spatial and Settlement Pattern


The Development Framework – Climate and Rainfall



The Development Framework - Land Capability Index and Livestock Potential





<p>Agricultural production expansion</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • High value crop production expansion opportunities around Baviaans LM • Apiculture initiatives, taking advantage of diverse flower species. • Flower production initiatives around Tsitsikamma. • Citrus, Angora Goat, Beef and Mutton production initiatives.
<p>Cooperative and Small-Scale</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Revive ostrich cooperatives around Grahamstown. • Small-scale maize production. • Development of Tucson centres, providing agricultural output for tourism initiatives.
<p>Aquaculture</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify, establish and enhance aquacultural initiatives along the Sunshine Coast Route. • Establish fishing fleets in St Francis Bay and Port Alfred to increase local employment, and better capture aquaculture potential in the area. • Further develop the Camdeboo Satellite Aquaculture, and establish linkages with additional cooperatives.








The Development Framework – ECBCP




The Development Framework – Rural Energy and Power



The Development Framework – Housing (Current)




