

Call for applications to participate in the Eastern Cape Livestock Production Improvement Scheme (EC-LPIS) 2020/21

The Department of Rural Development and Agrarian Reform invites all interested emerging livestock farmers of Eastern Cape Province to apply for participating in the Livestock Production Improvement Scheme as stipulated in the Agriculture Development Act 1999 (Act No 8 of 1999). The program's main objective is to improve genetic makeup of herds and flocks of subsistence and smallholder farmers. This is done through provision of pure bred bulls and rams. The heifers and ewes are earmarked for youth and women farmers that have farms that are not are stocked below 30% of their capacity.

Qualifying Applicants

•The applicant must have medium to long term legitimate right to use the land is applying on •The applicant has to be already in the livestock farming ie already have livestock is applying for; •The farmer must demonstrate capacity to be able to look after the number of animals is applying through a business/association/cooperative account:
